Surprise Mom with a handmade gift from the heart. These easy pop-up cards are fun and quick to make and even more fun to open. An adult gets to do the cutting and gluing, but the kids get to be creative with everything else!

Materials Found At Your H-E-B

2 sheets of construction paper of equal size (standard 8 1/2" x 11" is ideal, but not required)

Markers or crayons

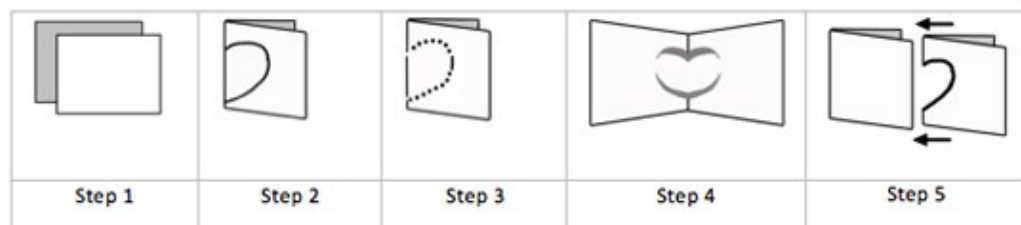
Scissors

Craft glue or a glue stick

Glitter and/or sequins (optional)

How To Make It

1. Select one of the pieces of construction paper for the inside of the card. Fold it in half width-wise.
2. Starting from the fold, draw half a heart or half a flower. This will be your pop-up. To ensure the pop-up stays tucked into the finished card, draw no further than the center of the page.
3. Using your scissors, cut along the line you just drew, starting from the fold, leaving a 1-inch part toward the center of the card uncut.
4. Open the card and push the pop-up inward, then refold the card so the pop-up folds one way and the card folds the other.
5. Take the second piece of construction paper and glue it to the back of the first, making sure you don't glue the pop-up. Then fold the card in half to close.
6. Let your kids decorate the card with markers or crayons. You can also help them use the glue stick to attach glitter or sequins.



Tips

- Let your kids pick two different colors for their construction paper—one for the inside and one for the outside of the card.
- To really personalize the card, your child can create their own design for the pop-up. Any design will work as long as you leave the outside of the pop-up shape attached to the card. Let them get creative!
- Markers and crayons aren't the only way to color. Finger-paints and watercolor paints are wonderful ways to decorate these cards as well.
- An adult should do the cutting for this project, but safety scissors are a good idea if your child

Help the kids show Mom and Grandma all the ways they love her with a creative flipbook made from a single sheet of paper. The kids will love this nifty paper folding trick, and decorating the resulting flipbook lets them show their artistic side.

Materials Found At Your H-E-B

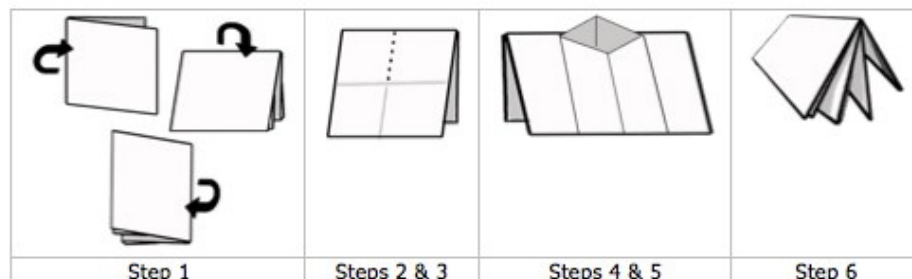
A piece of blank paper, standard 8 1/2" x 11" size

Scissors

Markers or crayons

How To Make It

1. Fold paper in half three times, smoothing the creases flat with the final fold.
2. Open the paper back to the first fold.
3. Following the crease (the dotted lines in the illustration below), cut from fold to junction of creases.
4. Open, then refold so your cut now runs along the folded edge.
5. Pushing the short sides toward each other, the center cut will poosh out and your book will start to fold itself.
6. Push it all together into the final book form.
7. Have your kids draw on each page of the book, one picture for every reason they love Mom.




Tips

- Keep in mind that the thicker the paper you use, the harder it will be for you or your child to fold. Printer paper may work better than construction paper for this reason.
- To inspire ideas for your child's drawings, talk to them about all the reasons they love Mom. What is your favorite thing to do together? Is she a great cook? Does she tell the best bedtime stories? Help your kids write a title on the front of the book, and have them sign the back of the last page.
- An adult should do the cutting for this project, but safety scissors are a good idea if your child wants to help.

Make Mother's Day special for the whole family, get some exercise and let your kids express their creativity with this fun and easy project. Now that spring has arrived, you can take advantage of the warm weather and create a beautiful gift for Mom that she will enjoy indoors and out.

Materials Found At Your H-E-B

A piece of blank paper—any size will do
Markers or crayons
Tape (optional)
Your walking shoes

How To Make It

1. Help your child decide on a short, preferably circular route for a walk. Around the block or around a park is perfect.
2. Draw a simple map of your route on the paper.
3. Strap on your walking shoes and grab your paper, markers or crayons and tape.
4. As you walk, let your child draw landmarks and interesting items along the way. Or, if they would rather, they can tape special things they find on their walk right onto the paper. Wildflowers, for example, are easy to find and tape to the paper.
5. On Mother's Day, give Mom the handmade map. Then take her by the hand and let your child show her the special walk and all of the fun things they found along the way.

Tips

- You may want to bring along a clipboard, binder or some other hard surface for your child to place the map on as they draw or tape.
- Encourage your child's imagination—anything can go on the map! People, dogs, squirrels, rosebushes, stop signs, even interesting cracks in the sidewalk are fun things to help your child note.
- If they choose to pick flowers for Mom along the way, help your child understand that wildflowers are okay but flowers from someone's garden are not. It may be useful to bring a wildflower guidebook along to help identify species, and be aware of protected or toxic flowers.
- Another idea is to take a picture of your child with each landmark, and help them tape those photos to the map. Keep in mind you will need to do this with enough time to get the photos printed before Mother's Day.
